Jodo Shinshu followers everywhere share in the appreciation of the birth and life of the founder of our Shin Buddhist tradition. Each year, we take this opportunity to reflect upon the life and journey of Shinran Shonin. We remember significant events that mark his path and the development of the Nembutsu teachings. The stories and the teachings have touched each of us. The Nembutsu path may have been a part of our family legacy for generations. 


