# HO ON KO and Bodhi Day

The mornings are darker and the days are getting shorter. The sun is not yet up as I run along the Alameda beach. Plovers run in groups along the water's edge, daring me to race them. On good days, I accept the challenge. November brings a bite in the air. At the temple, we look forward to the annual HOONKO Service.

HOONKO is the most important service in our Jodo Shinshu tradition. We recognize the death memorial of our founder, Shinran Shonin. The importance of HOONKO is for each of us to acknowledge Shinran Shonin. We are reminded to deepen our own appreciation of the Nembutsu path that has grown to mean so much to millions of fellow travelers throughout the world. Each of our lives becomes deeper and fuller as we recite Namo Amida Butsu and live the life of Nembutsu.

We are touched by the life and effort of Shinran Shonin in a very real way. A grassroots Buddhism was born, as he brought the Nembutsu path to the peasants ... farmers, fishermen, merchants ... people who worked hard every day. These are our people. Here is a poem by Goromatsu Maekawa who was 93 years old, translated by Rev. Taitetsu Unno. The poem is entitled "**JUST RIGHT** "

You, as you are, you are just right Your face, body, name, surname, For you, they are just right.

Whether poor or rich Your parents, your children, your daughter-in-law, your grandchildren They are, all for you, just right.

Happiness, unhappiness, joy and even sorrow For you, they are just right.

The life that you have walked, is neither good nor bad For you, it is just right.

Whether you go to hell or to the Pure Land Wherever you go is just right.

Nothing to boast about, nothing to feel bad about, Nothing above, nothing below.

Even the day and month that you die, Even they are just right.

#### The Life in which you walk together with Amida, There is no way that it can't be just right.

#### When you receive your life as just right Then a deep and profound faith begins to open up.

Shinran provided a spiritual path that is available to people of all walks of life. Beyond the aristocrats of high society or the monks dedicated to practice and study, everyone became welcomed to a way to connect to the infinite wisdom and compassion of Amida Buddha through the Nembutsu Path.

**The HOONKO Service this year will be held November 17 at 10:00 AM.** Three IMOP ministers from the Jodo Shinshu Center will join us and speak as part of their orientation program. We look forward to hosting them here! Please plan to attend and help to provide a big Alameda welcome!

December brings us our Bodhi Day Service to remember the day that Shakyamuni Buddha awakened to Enlightenment. This service is a reminder and our encouragement that we can each attain this same awakening in our lives. **Bodhi Day Service will be December 8 at 10:00 AM.** The calendars coincide this year, matching our service date to the awakening of the historical Buddha on the morning of December 8. Please join us for this special occasion service!

The final service of the year will be **Joya-E Year End Service on December 31 at 3:00 PM.** It is always a special gathering to come to the temple on the final day of the year. There is much to reflect upon as we look back on the past 12 months of our lives. The temple and the teachings have provided a foundation of stability for us to enjoy and endure the pleasures and the hardships we have encountered. We take a deep breath of reflection as we prepare for what will come next. We do this together.

### FBWA Conference - October 4-6

The BCA Federation of Buddhist Women's Associations Conference was held in San Jose at the Double Tree Hotel and at the San Jose Buddhist Church Betsuin. There were 6 attendees from our ABWA, including Rev. Dennis, Sharmon, Dorothy, Gayle, Joan, Tsueko and myself. The conference was hosted by the Coast District Buddhist Women's League, and the committee members and volunteers all did a great job! I felt inspired and impressed, and I gained more knowledge. I also made new friends and met old acquaintances!

The speakers and workshops were excellent! The keynote speaker was a former Congresswoman from Hawaii, Colleen Hanabusa, who as a Jodo Shinshu Buddhist, spoke of her experiences and perspectives on the conference theme, "Ichi Go Ichi E – Each Precious Moment, A Precious Treasure." As other speakers also spoke, the meaning of the theme became clearer to me. Retired minister, Rev. Yukiko Motoyoshi, also gave a wonderful talk. The LGBTQ+ Community Workshop had two panelists, Hoshina Seki and Rev. Ko'e Umezu. Each gave a very heartfelt talk about their respective journeys.
